# Equality and diversity



# Learner Support and Welfare Funds

The college has a number of funds which are there to help if you find yourself in financial difficulties that are affecting your attendance at college and your studies. Learner Support Funds can be used to buy special equipment, help with travel expenses and any other costs related to attending college to study.

These means-tested funds are limited and are allocated based on specific priorities and criteria.

# Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA)

If you are aged between 16 and 19 and taking a full-time course, you may be able to receive an EMA. It can pay you up to £30.00 per week while you are at college depending on your household income. You need to apply before you start college, so if you have not applied contact the EMA Co-ordinator on T: 01709 513333 as soon as you can.

Payment is made each week into your bank account, dependant on your attendance. There are also £100.00 bonus payments linked to your performance on your main course and core skills. The number of bonus payments will be either two or five depending upon the length of your course.

# Adult Learning Grant (ALG)

If you are aged over 19 and studying your first full level 2 or 3 qualification, you may be able to apply for an ALG of up to £30.00 per week. This grant is to help support students who are not receiving support from any other training allowances.

# Support with childcare costs


The college is able to provide support for your childcare costs if you are a full-time student, either for part or the full year.



# Progressing from level 3 to Higher Education (HE)

All students who achieve a level 3 course are provided with advice and guidance on how to progress to HE. DVC has worked hard to provide progression routes for students that will enable them to progress into HE and ultimately obtain a degree or equivalent award.

For most students who complete a level 3 course here at DVC, there is the opportunity to progress to HE and still study at the college.

Courses are full-time, but there is the opportunity for some students to access part-time HE courses. This gives students the chance to study in the evening whilst still being able to pursue a career. Higher level qualifications are aimed at meeting both the needs of students and the local skills sectors.

The college has strong links with Sheffield Hallam University (SHU) and in 1999 became an Associate College. This partnership has led to a formal agreement, which enables our HND students to progress into the third year of honours degrees in a variety of subjects. This relationship is continually developing through the activities of Higher Futures which is the Life Long Learning Network for the sub-region.

The college seeks to provide a challenging but supportive HE environment to a community with little or no tradition of HE. In a previous NFER (National Foundation for Education of Research) survey, it was revealed that only 10% of the parents of our level 3 students had progressed onto HE.

The success of our students is quite clearly evident by the huge number of family members who attend the annual graduation ceremony to share their achievement. As a result of this success, confidence grows and a great number of these students now progress to complete degree courses.



If you are enrolled on a level 3 qualification at the college, you will probably benefit from funding aimed at increasing participation into HE.

In recent years the college has benefited from the Aim Higher initiative to increase awareness of progression routes. This gives students on level 3 courses the chance to raise aspirations and promote achievement. This strategy has worked well, as a great deal of the growth in HE numbers has been due to students' increased desire to stay with the college and continue to study at a higher level.

As new industries begin to move into the area, the population requires different and higher level skills. DVC has recognised this and has been extremely proactive in meeting such needs by providing higher level courses that enable students to develop these much needed skills.

The college is currently developing foundation degrees in a number of vocational areas such as: health and well-being, sports coaching and development and care. We will work with the Life Long Learning Network to achieve this.

DVC remains committed to meeting the needs of both local students and local employers by providing high quality vocational HE.



# Step 1. Completing your application form

Application forms are available from the college and your school. If you would like us to post an application form to you, please call the college on T: 01709 513355

# Step 2. Acknowledgement of your application

When your application has been received we will write to you within a week to confirm we have received it. We will then contact you with an interview date.

# Step 3. Meet the tutors

We invite everyone who applies for a course at the college to meet the tutors. This is an informal chat for you to find out more about the course and where it leads. It also allows us to make sure that it is at the right level for you. You must attend this to make sure you get on a course.

You will then be offered a place at the college on the course most appropriate to you. In most cases this will be a conditional offer and depends upon you achieving the required grades at GCSE. You should receive written confirmation of this within 14 days of your interview. You then need to return your acceptance slip to confirm that you are interested and to reserve the place offered.

# Step 4. Keeping in touch

We will keep in touch with you until it's time to start your course and keep you up-to-date with all the events that are happening at the college. There are often events over the summer for prospective students.

# **Enrichment**

Enrichment is about getting the most out of your time with us and finding all kinds of learning enjoyable. It's about getting on with your work, making more friends, trying new things and getting qualifications that will help you to get a job, by making you stand out from the crowd.

# Additional qualifications

You can take some additional qualifications while you are with us, whatever course you are taking. These might include:

- Something to help you with any future job e.g. word processing, web design, health and safety, customer care or an enterprise qualification
- Job-specific training e.g. the ABTAC travel agency qualification, if you think you might want to work in a travel agency but are currently doing another course
- Sports coaching qualifications because you have an interest in sport or play for a local team

All of these activities can make your time at college more fun and give you the chance to mix with people outside your own course.

# GCSEs and A levels

We offer a limited number of GCSE, AS and A2 level courses, such as PE or English, which you can take alongside your main course. This includes some GCSE re-sits.

These are part of our options programme for all full-time students. Please ask your tutor about subjects you may be particularly interested in.

# Core Skills

We want all our students to do well in life and be able to succeed in employment. Your main qualifications are important, but so are other skills such as: working with others, problem solving, literacy and numeracy.

As a full-time student you will be supported to develop your communication, numeracy and IT skills and be expected to achieve qualifications or show that you have made progress. We are also keen that you develop enterprising skills. This means developing your drive, confidence and creativity to recognise and seize opportunities.

Everyone has an assessment at the start of their course to ensure that they are studying these skills at the right level and to make sure that they get the support they need.



# Message to parents and carers

Our recent Ofsted Inspection shows we are an ideal place for young people to learn!



As a parent as well as a Principal, I know that you will want the best for your young person. Although they sometimes don't agree with us about what is best, they appreciate our interest and support. Once a young person has finished having to go to school, they will only succeed in education if they are interested in what they are doing and feel supported.

Inspectors spent a lot of time talking to our students and reported that "many students speak warmly of their success in the college and the impact this has had on their lives and their aspirations. We also have to help them accept that having decided to come to college, there is work to be done and they need to be organised to balance this with their social life and possibly part-time work.



# **Apprenticeships**

With an Apprenticeship at DVC you can work and get training!

Is it for me?

You will need to be under 24 years of age and be in relevant employment or be motivated to find a suitable placement or employer. You will be in college 2 days per week and spend the rest of the week in the workplace.

DVC offer Apprenticeships in the following areas:

- Floor and Wall Tiling
- Plastering
- Joinery
- Brickwork
- Painting and Decorating
- Business Administration
- Exercise and Fitness
- Sport and Leisure Operations



# What is in it for me?

You will gain qualifications that employers recognise and real work experience to make you stand out from the crowd! You can achieve an NVQ, technical certificate and skills in numeracy/literacy. You will start on a level 2 Apprenticeship and can progress to level 3, and could even go onto university.

The harder you work, the quicker you will achieve, but on average it takes 12-18 months. Your pay will be decided between you and your employer (minimum £80.00 per week). Some placements may not pay but you could look to claim EMA to support your training. See the Money Matters page.

Are you aged between 16 and 18 and in a job without any qualifications? At DVC we can help you gain those qualifications and put you in touch with an adviser who can support you through the experience.

And you don't just get qualifications! Both you and your employer could receive a bonus payment if you successfully complete your course.

# Logistics and Transport

# What is it?

Logistics is the UK's 5th largest industry, employing over 1.7 million people and touching every business and household. The Dearne Valley has one of the highest growth rates among local employers. Logistics covers all activities relating to the movement (by road, rail, sea and air) and supply of goods. Its main function is planning and controlling the transport, storage and distribution of materials to ensure goods are available in our shops and manufacturing companies precisely when required.

Salvesens, DHL, Eddie Stobart, Beatson Clark, Norbert Dentressangle and Next are just a few of the large national and local logistics companies you may have heard of, or seen on our motorways. There is a vast range of job opportunities within the logistics sector, at all levels, with excellent career progression.

The new BTEC courses at DVC will prepare you for employment in a variety of roles in the logistics industry e.g. shipping clerk, transport assistant and traffic operator. You could also progress to HE for those who might want a management career in logistics. The courses are supported by a whole range of local and national logistics companies and students will have the opportunity for visits and real work experience.


